

Arizona Coalition for Military Families/Be Connected Cochise County. If you are an actively serving officer, veteran, spouse, surviving spouse, or other related circumstance, I recommend you check out the Arizona Coalition for Military Families at https://arizonacoalition.org/. This group has created several initiatives, including the Be Connected program.

Be Connected is a comprehensive direct-service and education for veteran communities to enrich their lives and the lives of others. Through three components – call, match, and learn – the program works toward the following goals:

- Reduce deaths by suicide in Arizona's population of service members and veterans.
- Build upon existing capacity and strengths within the service systems, adding a new layer of coordination and support.
- Demonstrate effectiveness and develop a sustainability plan that builds program components into systems and funding.

Under ACMF's leadership, and with many local public and private sector partners, we are developing a deeper and wider network in Cochise County. This network is being designed to enable veterans and military families to access wide varieties of resources for individual needs. The services include emergency support, inpatient care, long term support, and other



needs for daily living. I encourage you to check out the website. There are many opportunities for you or your family to use this organization to learn about and acquire support for your individual needs. To learn more about Be Connected, visit https://connectveterans.org/bcaz/ to familiarize yourself with what is available to you and to Arizona military families. Watch for more action in the coming months as the partnership grows and matures in capabilities and access portals.

LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS DIRECTOR James Clenney, LCDR, USN (Ret) j2k2c4@gmail.com (520) 234-5286

As you have seen through the regular Legislative Advocacy updates that I send out once or twice a month, there are many items of impact to service members. Currently we are closely following four bills in the Arizona Legislature.

HB2672: Property tax exemptions for 100% disabled veterans - Unfortunately, we still see no action in the Senate Committees. Learn more and encourage our Legislators to move forward!

SB1155: Ensures pay and income tax equity for members of the U.S. Public Health Service and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. - Still no posted action from the Senate committees. This is a low expense issue that recognizes the contributions and services rendered.

SB1704: Authorizes the use of Veteran Donation Fund monies to support Arizona State Veterans Homes. - This received a "Do Pass" from the House Federalism, Military Affairs & Elections committee on 3/10, no action in House Appropriations or Rules committees.

SB1021: Grants in-state tuition to contracted ROTC cadets at state universities. - This received a "Do Pass" from the House Appropriations committee, no action in the House Rules committee.

We are monitoring and I encourage your action re: the following National Advocacy items.

S.879 A bill to expand medical, employment, and other benefits for individuals serving as family caregivers for certain veterans, and for other purposes. H.R.2148 - To expand medical, employment, and other benefits for individuals serving as family caregivers for certain veterans, and for other purposes. There are 14.3 million military and veteran caregivers in the U.S. — a population larger than all but four U.S. states. And 74% of them are caring for veterans aged 60 or older, according to a 2024 RAND report — veterans whose need for long-term care is only increasing with time. The Veteran Caregiver Reeducation, Reemployment, and Retirement Act recognizes the critical role of PCAFC participants and aims to address the financial, professional, and emotional challenges they face. It seeks to extend health coverage, provide bereavement counseling upon a veteran's death, and support caregivers as they transition into the workforce or retirement. The bill also has the potential to reduce their future reliance on government assistance programs.



H.R. 1956 This was introduced March 6 would restore a critical housing benefit for servicemembers and their families, reversing a decade-old law that cut the Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) for all in uniform. Essentially, for most of the past decade, BAH has been authorized at 100% of allowance but paid at 95% of the authorization. The remaining 5% has been rerouted to "other needs" by DoD.


